Dear Resident:

Housing area residents of the Coyote Valley Band of Pomo Indians tested positive for COVID-19. Mendocino County Public Health is working with the individuals to conduct contact tracing. The Reservation is closed to **ALL** non-residents. Thank you for taking part in keeping our community safe. Protecting our elders, children, and community as a whole is of utmost importance.

**To that end, it is imperative to adhere to the following mandates:**

- The housing areas of the Reservation are closed to non-residents until further notice.
- Residents must not visit, gather or congregate with non-household members, including friends and relatives who are not household members.
- Residents must not invite any non-resident to the housing areas of the Reservation, or permit them to enter their residence.
- Residents must stay home except to make essential trips, such as to a grocery store, pharmacy, healthcare or daycare facility, or for purposes of employment.
- All persons on the Reservation must at all times wear a mask in all public spaces.

If you have a caregiver that requires an exception, you must contact the Coyote Valley Health Department at (707) 485-8723 in order for your caregiver to receive prior authorization to enter the Reservation to administer caregiver services. If you need to add anyone to your “Tenant Family Composition,” contact the Housing Department. Violations are subject to a fine under the Tribal Law and Order Ordinance, and such further action as may be required to keep our community safe. We will continue to monitor and respond to the evolving situation.
